- 1.1 Ashbury Public School commits to implementing the NSW Department of Education and Training (DoE) Aboriginal Education and Training Policy & Guide (2008) which proposes to redress Aboriginal disadvantage in three main ways: improving the outcomes of Aboriginal students (1.1.1, 1.1.2), providing education about Aboriginal culture to all students and staff (1.1.4), and collaborating with the Aboriginal community (1.1.6).
- 1.2 Ashbury Public School supports the main goal of the NSW DoE Aboriginal Education and Training Policy, 2008, point 1.1.2 which states: It is the goal of the Department that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students will match or better the outcomes of the broader student population.
